School Measures in Fight Against Epidemic

To fight against the coronavirus, the school requires all persons on the school premises to wear masks and have their body temperatures checked.

The school strictly follows protocols issued by the Centre for Health Protection: thorough cleaning and daily disinfection are carried out; good indoor ventilation is maintained; more water taps have been installed to facilitate frequent handwashing; an infrared body temperature scanning system has been set up at the school entrance to monitor staff and students' body temperatures. In addition, hand sanitisers are easily accessible on campus to ensure good personal hygiene among staff and students.

Earlier, a care package was sent to S6 students as encouragement for their DSE preparation. It included a message penned especially by Principal Wan, healthcare products, and snacks from the PTA.

Acts of Kindness Are the Best Antidotes

Amid the uncertainty brought about by the spread of novel coronavirus, Hoi Ping has been blessed with the care from teachers, parents and alumni.

In these challenging times, Hoi Ping remains dedicated to providing students with an exemplary education. To facilitate online learning, the Staff Development Team has organized training workshops for teachers, including one for live-teaching.


