Major Concern 1: Nourishing a proactive and purpose-driven life among students

One of our major concerns is to nurture students to be their own leaders, take the initiative to plan ahead, set goals and fulfill their tasks independently.

We hold various activities to develop students' skills for career and life planning. In September 2015, a talk named 'Be Your Kid's Coach' by Miss Cheung Siu Yung was held to help parents guide their children to develop their potential and set appropriate goals. Individual counselling sessions on goal setting for S1 to S3 students and JUPAS application for S6 students have also been conducted.

To prepare senior students for career-related experiences and making their career decisions, there were visits to Cargo Terminal in Airport, a working experience programme on event management in Cargo Terminal and 'Red Day'. A business-running experience day at a dessert restaurant owned by an alumna was also organized. Furthermore, the Proactive Life Week co-organized by the Counselling Committee and Health Education Committee was held in mid-March, 2016 to raise students' awareness of managing their emotion.

Our teachers have attended talks, experience sharing, and peer lesson observations, equipping themselves with effective teaching strategies. Parents have been invited to our talks, so that they can understand their children's learning progress.





Learning to read, reading to learn

Students nowadays are expected to possess reading skills and read extensively. To promote these aims in the whole school, the School Reading Award Scheme and School Reading Time are arranged.

In the School Reading Award Scheme, students have to submit a record of their reading experience and awards will be given to those who have good performance. In S3, there is a book rotation scheme; students take turn to read five sets of books. There are also book recommendations by teachers and students.

The Reading Week is organized annually. This year, there was a three-day Book Fair for English books, a Book Café, and reading talks. The response was very encouraging.

Unleashing the potential of diverse learners

To equip our teachers with effective strategies to cater for students' diverse needs, Ms Grace Ng Hing Hung, Curriculum Development Officer from the Curriculum Development Institute, Education Bureau, was invited to run a workshop for our teaching staff on catering for learner diversity.

At the subject level, an English Elite Class for top S4 students hones their four skills in English. An S2 English Enhancement Class is held to strengthen students' foundation in English and develop good learning habits. A highlight this year is a talk on writing for top S2 and S3 students, given by two internationally renowned authors.

Our talented students have enrolled in external gifted programmes, such as the Hong Kong Academy for Gifted Education, Stanford University Education Programme for Gifted Youth Academic Talent Search, etc. Many of them have achieved remarkable results.

Getting connected with our community

The mission of our school is to provide all-round education to students. To fulfil this mission, apart from academic studies, we hold different activities to increase students' knowledge about society.

For regular programmes, we hold a service learning project for all the S1 to S4 students. Under this project, S1, S2 and S3 students visit the aged, the kindergarten children and the mentally handicapped respectively while S4 visit the low-income families in Hong Kong.

We have also raised funds for Orbis for many years and held flag selling and blood donation annually. Moreover, talks are held for students with different topics. This year, talks on animal cruelty, world refugees and ethnic minorities were run. Furthermore, a theme-based programme was held to educate students about fair trade. Workshops, assembly talks and sale of fair trade products were run in school.

Furthermore, in order to familiarize students with Basic Law, games stalls were set up. We have also joined the anti-drug fashion design competition to promote a healthy lifestyle among students.



After understanding and interpreting the given poems, students have to follow the speaking rhythm, pace, volume, tone and acting designed by teacher-coaches. Students often design the above together with the coaches. The performances are indeed the results of shared effort and ideas.

This year, both the S1 & S2 English Choral Speaking Team and the S3 & S4 Choral Speaking Team achieved excellent results, with the former capturing the championship and the latter the first runner-up. The adjudicators applauded the teams' vitality and coordination in their performances.

However, the weather was extremely cold on the day of the competition and was not favourable for the athletes' performance. The team had a lot of room to improve in individual events on the first day, but fortunately on the final day, the relay teams demonstrated their determination to fight for Hoi Ping. Eventually, our C Grade and B Grade 4x100m relay teams won the championship and 4th position respectively.

With their great effort, our C Grade team finally achieved a second place and Girls B Grade team got the fourth place among 24 schools this year. We believe that we will keep fighting for the best next year.

External support : concerted effort in a thriving school

Various sources of external support enable our school to thrive professionally, academically, and socially. Apart from the QEF consultation and counseling services for our novice middle managers, through partnership with the Hong Kong Baptist University, different workshops and school visits were arranged to broaden the horizon of our middle manager team. Our school has also arranged a professional training camp in the Breakthrough Youth Village with the support of our alumnus, Simon Cheng.

We also work with other organizations and schools to enrich the learning environment. The Chinese Department has joined the EDB school-based support programme to support teachers' professional development. They have also collaborated with the History Department to hold joint school workshops to enhance students' exam skills. Joint school oral practices are arranged regularly with Australian International School to cultivate a rich English learning environment; and joint school workshops are provided for our school prefects and peer tutors to improve their leadership skills.

Parents and alumni are our precious partners; they have helped to organize outings, the Life Week, the Homecoming Day and also Information Day for Primary 6 students and parents.
