The arrangements for school activities fitted everyone's needs in the pandemic. There were a variety of school activities gear toward students' whole-person development. The 'Wanna Meet You' sessions provided a great platform for students to contemplate life goals, dreams, and aspirations. Cultivating Leadership and Class Spirit in the New Normal: Student leaders hosting online team building activities for their peers

During the special vacation, our students showcased their tremendous talent through holding class-based team-building activities for their classmates on Google Meet. Our student leaders 4A Chau Lok Yee (Chloe), 4B Wong Yue Hei (Hayden), 4C Leung Lok Yi (Iris), 4D Cheng Hiu Ching (Tracy), and 4E Chan Yi Ching (Jenny) were interviewed to share how they led their class committees to organize captivating activities as well as what they learned.

Hosting activities wasn't as simple as what we expected when done virtually. One of the most challenging things for the student leaders was time management. When everything has to be conducted online, there are uncertainties that need to be addressed; for instance, the speed of the electronic devices and the wi-fi signal may be unstable and out of their control. There was a class that finished playing all the games in just twenty minutes when the whole session was supposed to last for an hour; another class overran a lot owing to multiple technical difficulties. The student leader in the former case had to improvise and think of another activity immediately, making sure that this precious time for classmates to bond would not be wasted. This is without a doubt not an easy task to handle, but our student leaders pulled it off, so everyone appreciated their contribution.

After this rewarding experience, student leaders have learned to be prepared, flexible, and cope with unexpected challenges. Moreover, it has unleashed their leadership potential and enhanced their communication skills as they liaised with their peers and class teachers. As a team, the leaders and other members of the class committees backed each other up when tackling challenges. The bonds between classmates have been impressively strengthened, keeping everyone connected despite the phyiscal isolation. This has been a valuable experience for all.
